Open-Ended Questions for Produce Inspections

Some suggested opening questions are noted below for each section.

Soil

- What type of soil do you have?
- What are your primary struggles with your soil? (compactions, very low pH, etc.)
- What are your main strategies for improving your soil?
- Are you seeing nutrient deficiency symptoms?
- What soil amendments are you using? Are they produced on the farm?

Weeds

- What are your main weed pressures?
- How do you manage weeds on your farm?
- Do you have different strategies for perennial vs. annual weeds?

Pests

- What are your main pest pressures?
- How do you monitor pest populations?
- What's your approach to pest management?
- How do you keep records of pest sightings and interventions?

Disease

- What disease pressures do you have?
- How do you manage disease?

Preventing Contamination

- Can you describe the buffers that exist between your growing area and other activities?
- Usually easiest if this is broken down by North, South, East, West
- Tell me about your equipment. Do you borrow and/or loan out equipment, tools, or sprayers? If so, how do you prevent contamination from conventional fields?

Seeds and planting stock

- How do you make your seed selections?
- Do you buy any transplants? If so, how do you ensure they meet CNG standards?
- How many different crops do you grow?

Environment

- What are the primary sources of energy for your farm?
- What steps, if any, are you taking to reduce fossil fuel use?
- What steps, if any, are you taking to conserve water?
- What other conservation practices do you employ on your farm?

For each section, after you've learned a bit about their practices you may also solicit the farmer's ideas for *how they might improve their practices in that particular area*, whether with respect to outcomes, sustainability, efficiency, minimizing inputs, etc. Probably you'd just do this for sections where there's notable room for improvement (rather than for every section).
